Tropical Terry by Jarvis.

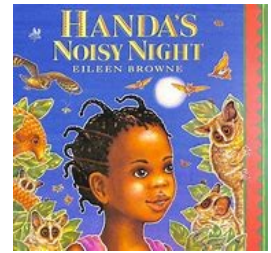

Handa's Noisy Night. By Eileen Browne.

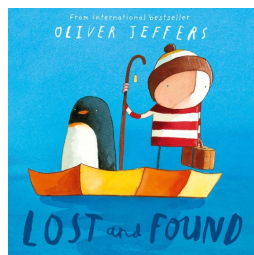

recommends.... We're going to find the Monster! By Malorie Blackman and Dapo Adeola

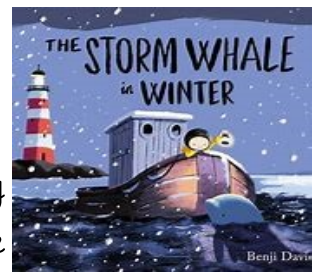

By Benji Davies

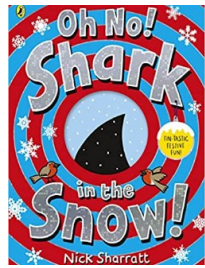

By Nick Sharratt

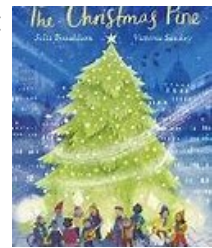

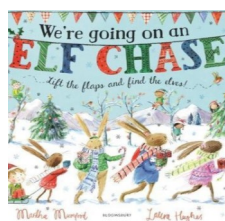
